We'd like to specifically acknowledge the time and effort of Carina from Red Cross who has provided translation at so many classes and driving lessons! Without Carina's input this would not have been so successful.

News - Removing Barriers

A student who attends Alternative Education was not getting there until after 9.30am each morning due to having to take his younger siblings to Primary School. Then they were needing to leave by 2.30pm each afternoon to pick them up again as Mum was working before and after school at commercial cleaning jobs.

We spoke with Mum to say that this could not continue, and looked at how REAP Marlborough could help the whānau overcome the barriers to being able to work so that Mum could be there before and after school for the younger tamariki.



Mum expressed an interest in becoming a barista so she attended a 4 hour workshop with our Barista Tutor, Brooke. This went really well and Mum gained confidence.

Just to make sure Mum was fully confident Shona also arranged a 1:1 follow-up barista training session. We then enrolled her on a First Aid course, and finally helped her to write a CV.

An interview was arranged by Mum herself at the local BP petrol station, and Mum armed with her new skills and CV was interviewed for a Barista position 4.30pm - 11.30pm (these hours meant that Dad would be home to look after the young tamariki).

GREAT NEWS! Mum got the job and now our rangatahi is no longer late to his classes and is more engaged with his learning!

News - Connecting communities

We were approached by the Rural Women NZ Kenepuru Branch asking if we could help them with finding a Nail Technician to help out at the Pamper Day they were putting on for rural women from the Sounds after the recent flood events. The event was held at the Havelock Town Hall.

Selena from our REAP team knew that Yisella, one of our lovely former refugees from Colombia was a nail technician so Shona from our Adult Community Education team arranged for Yisella, with the support from Carina (Red



Cross Translator) to attend the Pamper Day - what a great success! And this was the perfect way for Yisella to connect with the wider Marlborough community.

2022 was capped off recently by our team during our planning day at Misty Cove Winery! We had a relaxed but fun day packed with planning exercises, team-building, and korero with our newest team members (Renee Wood who facilitates our Adult Community Education programmes in Kaikoura and Sara Harwood who has been with the former refugees teaching the Learners Drivers Licence programme).

And the delicious food and drink provided by Misty Cove Wines along with the gorgeous Wairau Valley views made it even more enjoyable!

Happenings in Kaikoura

The end of the year has arrived in a flurry of activity for our team down in Kaikōura with driving lessons, first aid courses, computer classes and an organic gardening course which is still running each Saturday.

In the third week of November, a defensive driving course was held for those people on their restricted licence wanting to get their full licence. The course is designed to make the student a more defensive driver and reduces your restricted licence time down from 18 months to 12 months. We had 12 students attend this and hope to run another one of these courses in the middle of next year.

We have also run a couple of first aid courses over a period of two days from November 14-15 covering unit standards 6401 & 6402 and for those wanting a more comprehensive programme, 6400. Our next course is booked for March 30-31.

On 30th November, we had the last class for our six week Computer Skills Course. We had seven attend this course covering basic computer skills and had some really great feedback!

Kaikōura (continued)

Organic Gardening, a course which has been running each Saturday and will continue until the December, covers what is organic, soil science, crop rotation/intercropping/moon planting, compost and fertiliser, pest control and beneficial insects.

This course is \$5 per Saturday or \$20 for the full six week course. This is held at the Kaikōura Community Garden which is run by volunteers who meet every Friday at 1pm to maintain and grow the garden.

Please don't hesitate to come along to the last Saturday if you are keen.


RESOURCE - STEM Buddies
